Glaucoma remains one of the leading causes of vision impairment globally and accounts for approximately 40% of blindness cases in Singapore.⁽¹⁾ In line with Singapore's growing emphasis on preventive healthcare and early intervention, strengthening awareness, screening, and sustained medical management of glaucoma is critical.^(2,3) While surgical interventions are available, many patients seek to optimize medical therapy prior to surgery, highlighting the importance of accessible and well-tolerated treatment options that support long-term disease control and vision preservation.^(4,5)

The newly introduced ophthalmology portfolio is intended to support healthcare professionals in personalizing treatment approach and in glaucoma management, allowing clinicians to tailor treatment according to patients' individual preferences, disease progression, and existing health conditions. The expansion aligns with current clinical practice, where long-term disease control, tolerability, and adherence are key considerations in glaucoma management. By offering additional therapeutic choices, DKSH Singapore seeks to support more personalized treatment pathways that balance efficacy with patient comfort and lifestyle needs.

"DKSH's entry into ophthalmology reflects the company's focus on unmet medical needs and patient-centric care," said Reuben Ong, Vice President, Business Unit Healthcare at DKSH Singapore. "By expanding its ophthalmology portfolio, we aim to support healthcare professionals in the management of glaucoma through enabling more personalized approaches that consider patient needs, clinical factors, and long-term care objectives."
